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Dear Mayor and City Council members,

I'm writing to ask you **not** to approve the request by Reid Thompson for conditional zoning on Maxwell Street at your October 9th meeting.

The staff report concerning this request points out many good reasons why this application should not be approved, including the fact that it would be inconsistent with council's past actions taken to eliminate STVRs in residential neighborhoods.

His justification for this request does not make sense--I do not see how the street can be uninhabitable to long term tenants and at the same time ideal for STVRs. This neighborhood is a good location for much needed long term rentals; walkable to downtown and shopping, and near a bus line.

Please don't be swayed, as the Planning and Zoning Commission apparently was, by Mr. Thompson's claim that the situation with Whole Foods (Green Life) Grocery somehow justifies his request to create a Lodging Zone on Maxwell Street. I live in the Five Points Neighborhood, and have often walked on that street in the past five years. I agree that allowing Green Life Grocery to install an unbuffered loading dock on Maxwell Street was a huge mistake, and that it causes regular visual and audible disruptions to residents on the block. And, in my opinion, the city should be trying to solving that problem. But, I do not agree with Mr. Thompson that the solution is to make Maxwell Street a Lodging Zone which would allow STVRs.

Sorry for the late reply.Â

We know that a gravel lot was permitted separately for Greenlife. It was reviewed and approved as a Level I under permit number PZ 04-10000102, submitted in November 2004 and closed out in February 2005.Â We don't have a site plan for that approval so we have been trying to obtain historical aerial imagery to understand if the lot was ever expanded. During our review of this imagery we realized that some of the aerials we were looking at appeared to be of the same exact image, but that they were labeled with different dates. This imagery came from a state database and we are in the process of reconciling this information to make sure we are using accurate data.

I'll follow-up with you once we sort this out.
