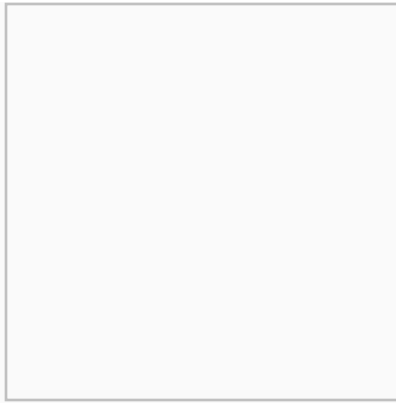
Our understanding of details and information available is changing quickly, below is the background and updates I have at this moment.

Background:

SNAP recipients to lose benefits at farmers markets: Many SNAP participants will no longer be able to redeem their money at more than 1,700 farmers markets after July 31, when an Austin-based software company that processes mobile transactions ends its service, FERN [reports](#) in partnership with The Washington Post.
