Our neighbors have been shown to disproportionately bare the brunt of Asheville's economic and social policies, which have for years placed Black Ashevilleans towards the bottom in categories such as the achievement gap, racial disparities in traffic stops, minority business contracts, home ownership, and more.

The Real Asheville has initiated a process of further defining these statistics, showing changes over time, and creating big picture assessments. Moving forward, however, we would like to fundraise and provide scholarships so that the COMMUNITY can take over these processes and build a movement for social change from the bottom up.
