Here is Summit NJ we have required Head-In Parking only in all our lots/garages for many years. Many of our lots are permitted with the permit displayed on the back window of the vehicle. This enables the officers to scan the bar-coded permit or enter the plate. When vehicles are backed in the officers then need to try to find the permit and many vehicles are backed up against the wall of the garage.

While drivers prefer backing-in, we prefer head-in so that they must take their time exiting their space. Backed in vehicles have a tendency to just fly out of spaces.

We too are looking to go to LPR enforcement. Good luck with your transition.
